Oxford House

- Drug and alcohol recovery houses for males and females individually run by residents.
- Decisions concerning occupancy are made as a group. Participants must be working and cooperate with house rules such as being clean, sober, and sharing chores.
- A recovering individual can live in an Oxford House for as long as they do not drink alcohol, do not use drugs, and pay an equal share of the house expenses. The average stay is about a year, but many residents stay 3+ years.
- A recovering individual must complete a standard "Application for Membership" and be interviewed by the residents of the house he or she want to live in.

- Halfway house, residential long-term treatment, independent living, and outpatient treatment.
- Residential treatment program involves 3 phases:
 - Phase I Intensive Residential Treatment (28-day program)
 - Phase II Transitional Residential Treatment (Halfway House)
 - Phase III Independent Living
- Fees
 - Self-Payment: \$8,700/28 days (max 28 days) for Phase I, \$4,500/30 days for Phase II (max 180 days), \$12,500/28 days (max 28 days) for Phase III.
 - If you need treatment but do not feel you can afford it, please call to speak with an Intake Coordinator about alternative and lower cost funding.

- Aims to support LGBTQIA+ and BIPOC communities.
- Provides fully furnished rooms that can accommodate two residents at a time with a shared bathroom.
 - Some bedding and household supplies are provided.
 - Residents supply their own food and prepare their own meals.
- Requirements:
 - Residents must help with household chores.
 - o Residents must maintain employment and engage in a recovery program.
- Cost:
 - Program costs \$600 a month. There is a \$40 application fee.

- Most household expenses are included in the monthly fee except for food, clothing, and personal hygiene products
- Monthly rent varies per location. Visit website for more details.
 - New clients are charged a \$150 admission fee upon move in along with first month's program fees.
 - Aurora houses, Allison, and Tribe are \$945/month.
 - Centennial houses, Denver Tech Center house, Charles, Philips, and Jamison are \$1075/month.
