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Free Mental Health First Aid Classes! *Start off the New Year Gaining Valuable Skills . . .*

WHEAT RIDGE – Depression. Anxiety. Substance abuse. These are but a few of the mental health challenges people in Colorado struggle with every day. In fact, one out of five people you meet has struggled with a mental health or substance use problem at some point in their lives.

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is an innovative, 8-hour course designed to give you the tools to recognize a range of mental health problems and the skills and confidence to help someone in a mental health crisis. MHFA training helps a layperson assist someone in crisis, such as contemplating suicide, until professional help arrives. The program provides a concrete action plan that includes assessing risk, respectfully listening to and supporting the individual in crisis, and identifying appropriate professional help and other supports. As a community partner, we are proud to offer Mental Health First Aid to the community.
