  - Short-term advocacy, crisis support, and assistance with planning for safety.
  - Individual and group support for male and female victims and children who have been exposed to domestic violence.
  - Most services are available in English and Spanish
  - Education outreach provided in schools
- **Legal Advocacy Program**, 303-271-6559
  - The Protection Order Clinic provides legal advocacy service for victims of stalking sexual assault, and domestic violence.
    - The clinic is available for walk-ins from 9 am -12 pm and from 1 pm-5 pm in the Victim/Witness Unit of the Jefferson County Courthouse.
    - First Judicial District Courthouse-100 Jefferson County Pkwy., Golden, CO 80401
  - The Legal Clinic offers victims of domestic violence, stalking, and sexual assault the opportunity to meet with volunteer attorneys and/or paralegals regarding family law issues.
    - Held two times per month at 7 pm, Family Tree's administrative offices. Please call 303-271-6559 for eligibility requirements and to register.
  - How to Help Workshop serves family and friends of domestic violence victims.
    - Held on an as needed basis at Family Tree's administrative office. To register for the workshop, call 303-463-6321.

  - Serves the following areas: Arvada, Golden, Edgewater, Lakeside, Mountain View, Morrison, Wheat Ridge, and Colorado School of Mines.
  - Services included: 24-Hour Crisis Hotline, 24-hour on-scene response at request of law enforcement, criminal justice information, referrals to community resources, children’s advocacy protocol, emotional support, third-party mediation, victim’s rights information, domestic violence court advocacy, and assistance with the application for crime victim compensation.

**Aspire News App:** <https://www.whengeorgiasmiled.org/the-aspire-news-app/>

- Looks like any other iPhone or Android news app, but it is actually a potentially lifesaving domestic violence alert system. It is disguised as a normal icon and even has a decoy home page, so you'll be safe if your abuser takes your phone.
- When you go to the "Help" section of the page, it provides a list of local domestic violence resources and a "Go Button," which you can activate when you are in danger. The "Go Button" will send a pre-typed or pre-recorded message to multiple trusted, preselected contacts or even 911, saying that you are in trouble. Additionally, once the app is activated, your phone will begin recording audio of everything that is going on in the room, which can be used as evidence for any legal proceedings that may stem from the incident.
- The App does not serve as a replacement for emergency services – in any situation where you feel that you may be at risk, please dial 911 or your local emergency number.
