- Serves any HIV-positive individual living in Adams, Arapahoe, Broomfield, Clear Creek, Denver, Douglas, Gilpin or Jefferson counties.
- Counseling services provide therapeutic support for people infected and affected by HIV through individual, couples, family, and group counseling.
- Support groups
 - To attend, all new group participants must contact the group facilitator or case manager prior to attending the first session
- Free testing to anyone age 13
 - Walk-in testing offered every Thursday 2:00pm to 6:00pm with the last walk-in taken at 5:30pm
 - Free testing is also offered any weekday by appointment between 9:00am and 5:00pm. Call 303 837-0166 ext. 471 to make an appointment.
- Clean syringe access
 - Walk in free and confidential service is available Monday - Thursday, 2:00pm to 6:00pm. at the DCAP office. No appointments are required.
- Bus tickets are available twice per month to clients who meet certain financial requirements
- To become a client:
 - Contact DCAP Intake or send an email through the organization's webpage
 - At your initial appointment, you will need a copy of your HIV/AIDS diagnosis from your healthcare provider, proof of residence, and proof of income
 - DCAP is able to assist in each step of the process
- Services are free and confidential. Some services may have financial eligibility requirements as defined by grant funder.

 - As of 7-15-11, waiting list for services. No timeframe given. They call back when there is an opening based on the need of the patient.

Membership is open to all drug addicts, regardless of the particular drug or combination of drugs used.
- There are no dues or fees for membership; while most members regularly contribute small sums to help cover the expenses of meetings, such contributions are not mandatory.
