- Certain medications are not covered; contact for an individual screening.
- Income limits apply and various forms of documentation will be required.

- Card to help members of AARP who are 50 years or older pay for medicines that are not covered by Part D plans.
- Costs \$19.95 and will give discounts up to 53% with an average savings of 20%.

- Colorado Drug Card is free to help the uninsured and underinsured save on prescription discounts (discounts for vision, eyeglasses, hearing and diabetic supplies and more).
- The Colorado Card can only be used alone, not in conjunction with any other plan.
 - If you have Medicare, but are in the “dounut hole” between coverage and when the designated year starts over, you can use the Colorado Drug Card.
- Go to the website, print off the prescription card and use the card at participating pharmacies. *If you cannot print the card, you can visit any King Soopers/City Market pharmacy and they will process your prescription through the program.*
- Call the toll-free number for any questions concerning coverage or network pharmacy locations.

- Call number above or go to website to request a free card to help you save an average of 15% on brand-name and 55% on generics.
- Can be used by any member of the family regardless of age or income.
- There is no paperwork to completed, no limit on the number of prescriptions filled and all drugs are subject to discount. The card never expires.
- Also can help you to apply for programs to help save on medications if you cannot afford your medication with this card. Call for more information.

- A program that provides a way to buy generic prescription medications at a discounted price. Over 400 generic medications available.



- Anyone who earns less than the maximum income are eligible (example: family size of one is \$32,490/year, family size of two is \$43,710/year)
- You can use this program even if you are enrolled in another (i.e. Medicare Part D)
- Enrollment is free and medicines cost \$20, \$30 or \$40 for a 180-day supply.

- Medications are sent through the mail and delivered to the address you choose.
- Users complete the downloadable application, get a prescription for a 90 or 180 day supply of medication (up to 3 refills accepted) and send in payment.

- Only available to people who are not eligible for Medicare and have no prescription drug coverage of any kind. There are income guidelines (less than 45,000/year for a single person).
