- Transportation services.
 - Service animals are welcome.
 - Donation based rides are available 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
 - Notes: For ride requests call 3-7 days in advance, it is recommended to call 7 days in advance as their schedule fills quickly
 - For rides in Denver Metro area, call: 303-235-6972
 - For rides in rural Jefferson, Clear Creek, or Gilpin, call: 303-679-2552
 - Call 24 hours in advance for cancellations, multiple missed rides could result in services being suspended for 30 days.

- Provides: Door-to-door transportation services
- Hours: Monday - Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Fares:
 - Individual Transportation within Lakewood - \$3 each way (\$6 round trip)
 - Transportation Outside of Lakewood - \$4 each way (\$8 round trip)
 - Group Grocery Shopping - \$1.50 each way (\$3 round trip)
 - Group trips to the Volunteers of America dining site at Clements Community Center – Free, contributions always welcome
