Post-9/11 GI Bill

Overview of Benefits:

- Covers all in-state tuition and fees (paid to school) for public schools.
 - For those attending private or foreign schools, tuition and fees are capped at the national maximum rate (2017 had \$22,085 cap)
- Monthly housing allowance if enrolled half-time or more and at least one class is in person (paid to the veteran)
- Up to \$1000 per year for books and supplies (paid to the veteran)
- Can be used for college and professional training programs
- Provides up to 36 months of benefits

Eligibility:

- 90 Days of Active Duty service after 9/10/2001
- Honorable discharge – other discharges in limited cases
- Use with 15 years of discharge

Yellow-Ribbon Program:

- An agreement between school and VA to cover tuition costs greater than in-state tuition
- May help veterans attending private schools or are out-of-state

Montgomery GI Bill Active Duty:

Overview of Benefits:

- Provides a monthly benefit to enrolled veterans (paid to veteran)
- Benefit based upon veteran's course load
- Can be used for college and professional training programs
- Provides up to 36 months of benefits

Eligibility:

- 3 years of continuous active duty service, 2 years in some circumstances
- Honorable discharge
- Had \$100 per month deducted from military pay checks for first 12 months of service

Enrollment

 - *Note: Montgomery GI Bill can be converted to Post-9/11 GI Bill in some circumstances

VA Education and Career Counseling

Overview of Benefits:

- Assistance with understanding career options
- Guidance on the effective use of VA benefits
- Academic or adjustment counseling and personalized support to help remove any barriers to success

Eligibility:

- Active Duty within 6 months of discharge
- Veterans during 1st year following discharge
- Service Members/ Veterans currently eligible for a VA educational benefit
- Anyone currently using a VA education benefit

Enrollment:

- Complete VA Form 28-8832 and mail it to nearest VA regional office
