- Rapid rehousing, homeless prevention assistance, temporary financial
- Qualifications: Veterans residing in permanent housing but at risk of homelessness, homeless but scheduled to be permanently housed within 90 days, and/or having exited permanent housing in the last 90 days
- Qualifications: must be below 50% area median income (AMI) for family size in their county, or Denver
- Verifications requested: DD214 (must not have received a dishonorable discharge), income verification or willingness to certify themselves as homeless
- Call 1-720-501-3368 for a phone screening
