Shelter services are provided in both English and Spanish, and necessities are provided by the shelter program, including bedding, food, personal hygiene items, and basic medical care. The length of stay in the shelter is 30 days and extensions may be granted.
 - Specialized services for LGBTQ
 - Other languages can be accommodated
 - Services are free
