- Please follow these directions to register:
 - Visit the website to navigate to your local camp.
 - Find your camp location and click on the register button.
 - Select the week(s) that you would like to register for.
 - Press the register button.
 - You will be prompted to login.
- Deposit and Registration Fee
 - Enter a \$25 deposit for each session your child will attend, and a one-time \$35 registration fee per family.
 - Total all deposits along with the registration fee, and provide one payment for that amount, prior to attending.
 - *Full payment is due two weeks before the start of each week.*
If your payment is not received by the appropriate due date, your reservation and deposit for that session and all remaining weeks will be forfeited.
 - Call 720-524-2792 to get information to enroll in electronic funds transfer. This will ensure that you don't miss a camp payment.
 - Weekly deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable.
 - If you register more than one child, please call 720-524-2792 to have your second child registration fee credited to your account - this will not be refunded.
- Options to Reserve Space
 - Online: visit www.denverymca.org/camps to get started
 - Walk-in: For CCAP and approved scholarship families, bring in your CCAP letter of authorization or Scholarship approval letter. The Y will register you and can assist you in setting up your online account.
 - Walk-ins only accepted at the Schlessman Family YMCA (2625 S. Colorado Blvd., Denver 80222) or Susan M. Duncan YMCA (6350 Eldridge St., Arvada, CO).
 - Please be prepared to spend 30 minutes to complete registration.
- **ALL CAMP LOCATIONS ARE CLOSED ON Memorial Day and Fourth of July.**

 - Fees: \$35/day and \$30/day for additional children in the same family; plus \$30 annual registration fee that includes a t-shirt. Field Trips are \$13 and up.
 - What to Bring: Children enrolled in the Sun Camp are asked to bring a water bottle, sack lunch, two snacks (morning and afternoon), swim attire, towel, camp swim shirt, and tennis shoes every day.
 - Registration Information
 - Families must register in person at the Wheat Ridge Recreation Center.
 - A non-refundable annual registration fee of \$30 is due at the time of registration.
 - Registration for individual days may be available and is on-going; however, registration for each of those days must be at least one week in advance.
 - A minimum of 10 children and a maximum of 39 children are enrolled in the camps.
