<u>Individual and Family Health First Colorado (Medicaid)</u>

Health First Colorado is public health insurance for low-income Coloradoans who qualify. You may be eligible based on your income.

Medicaid Income Limits:

Health First Colorado Buy-In

The Health First Colorado Buy-In Program allows qualifying individuals to "buy-in" to Health First Colorado (Medicaid). It is available to people who are disabled (verifiably through SSDI or the State Disability Determination), 16+ years of age and who are working at least one hour per month.

If you qualify, you pay a monthly premium based on your income. If you receive the Buy-In in addition to Medicare, you will pay the Health First Colorado premiums *instead of* the Medicare premiums. All participants are considered a family of one.

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Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+)

CHP+ is available for children (18 and under) and pregnant women (19 and older) who do not have other health insurance and who do not qualify for Health First Colorado (Medicaid).

^{*}Pregnant women, Native Americans, and Alaskan Natives do not have to pay annual enrollment fees or copays. Co-pays may apply for children covered under CHP+.

Income can be earned income, unearned income, alimony, etc. Child Support does not count as income. Income limits are not exact; limits vary by household compositions (based on tax filing rules). You may still be eligible if you earn more than the limit listed here.

Note: Pregnant women or children (18 and under) who need healthcare immediately can apply at a Presumptive Eligibility Site. Ask Navigation for information on PE Health First Colorado/CHP+.
