  - o including bedding, food, personal hygiene items, and basic medical care. The length of stay in the shelter is 30 days and extensions may be granted.

#### **Phone Apps**

- Looks like any other iPhone or Android news app, but it is actually a potentially lifesaving domestic violence alert system. It is disguised as a normal icon and even has a decoy home page, so you'll be safe if your abuser takes your phone.
- When you go to the "Help" section of the page, it provides a list of local domestic violence resources and a "Go Button," which you can activate when you are in danger. The "Go Button" will send a pretyped or pre-recorded message to multiple trusted, preselected contacts or even 911, saying that you are in trouble. Additionally, once the app is activated, your phone will begin recording audio of everything that is going on in the room, which can be used as evidence for any legal proceedings that may stem from the incident.
- The App does not serve as a replacement for emergency services in any situation where you feel that you may be at risk, please dial 911 or your local emergency number.
