Annual Denver Toy Shop will take place December 6, 2025 at the National Western Complex, 4655 Humboldt Street, Denver, CO 80216

- Registration REQUIRED:
 - o Registration will open on the website on December 4. To participate, **registration is required** and it will open on the Thursday before the event at 9 am. Registration links will be available on our <u>Facebook page</u> and website. Due to high demand, places fill up quickly, usually within 30 minutes. If you can't register, you can come at 3 p.m. to see if there are any toys left, but keep in mind that the event closes at 3:15 p.m. Anyone who arrives after this time will not be able to buy.
- What you need to bring: A large bag or something to carry your toys, as we will not provide bags.
 - Birth certificates for each child you wish to purchase.
 - Photo ID of parent requesting the toys.
- Important requirements:
 - A full survey is required before you can purchase, which will be provided on the day of the event.
 - o Birth certificates and photo ID requirements are strictly enforced, no exceptions will be made.
 - You can only buy for your own children.
- What to Expect- Each child will receive:
- A new toy
- A stuffed animal
- A card game (optional, as we understand that not all children can play cards; however, no substitutions will be available)
- In addition, the bikes will be delivered throughout the day in limited quantities. The bikes are available in various sizes and colors, and a certain number will be distributed in each time slot. Once the bikes are sold out for a time slot, there will be no more available, so don't promise your child a bike from this event.

- Denver Santa Claus Shop invites parents who are referred to DSCS from Denver Human Services, Social Service Agencies and Community Partners to Shop for toys for their children ages 0-11 in early December each year.
 - If you are a Denver resident and receiving assistance from Denver Human Services, your children ages 0 11 are automatically qualified for this year's toy distribution. If you are not receiving services from DHS, you need to be registered with and receiving assistance from some type of social service agency or community partner.
 - If you are a qualified Denver resident and have children ages 0-11, you may pre-register for the toy distribution by going to denversantaclausshop.org and clicking on the "Registration" button. Registration typically opens mid-November.

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP)
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
- Old Age Pension (OAP)
- Help for the Disabled in Need (AND)
- Aid to the Blind (AB)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Foster Children Eligible for Medicaid
- If the household does not participate in any of the above public assistance programs, the household must have a combined gross income that does not exceed the maximum income limit for the applicable household size.
