Offers treatment programs to treat depression, anxiety, bipolar symptoms, hallucinations and delusions, suicidal and homicidal ideation and co-occurring substance abuse issues. Individuals age 65 and older may participate in programming if they can manage their activities of daily living, are medically stable and can benefit from our therapeutic services.

- Acute Stabilization (Inpatient Hospitalization)
  - Provides crisis stabilization and helps patients and families develop healthy coping skills needed to navigate life challenges. Through the discharge planning process from all levels of care, the treatment team helps patients find external care providers for continued recovery after discharge.
- Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP)
  - This program is for adults and serves individuals dealing with mental and emotional disorders. It may be an alternate option when conventional outpatient therapy is not sufficient or for those transitioning out of inpatient care. Ascent allows patients to receive structured treatment during the day through several hours of therapy and skill building groups. Treatment includes cognitive-behavioral therapy and development of coping strategies in a supportive recovery environment.
- Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)
  - Elevate is Highlands Behavioral Health System's intensive outpatient program (IOP) for adults who struggle with their mental and emotional health. The program is designed for individuals that need more support than conventional outpatient therapy, but are higher functioning and able to maintain their daily activities.

The Geriatric Behavioral Health Unit in Fort Morgan, Colorado, is a 14 patient/7 room acute unit that specializes in treating patients 55 years of age and above who have behavioral issues related to dementia and/or psychiatric issues.

- In our program, each patient has a treatment team of medical and clinical professionals. They work together to pinpoint the nature of the program and help the patients and their families begin adjusting to the disease process of dementia. The average length of stay is 14-21 days.
- Medical Insurances
  - At this time, we are able to accept Medicare with supplemental plans; secondary Medicaid plans; PERA Retirement plans; and Innovage.
  - Unfortunately, those with primary Medicaid, HMO Medicare buy-out plans, Humana, United Health Care, VA, or Kaiser Insurance are not covered for our services.

Older adults 55 years old and older can receive the benefits of our inpatient program, partial hospitalization program, intensive outpatient program and electroconvulsive therapy (ECT). The Behavioral Health and Wellness Center at The Medical Center of Aurora (TMCA) offers a comprehensive older adult and senior mental health program. We deliver individualized treatment strategies for older adults with emotional health stressors or symptoms that cannot be safely and adequately addressed on an outpatient basis.

Intensive outpatient program

- Inpatient Program
  - Upon admission to the program, patients undergo a comprehensive psychiatric and physical assessment. After the initial assessments, an individual behavioral health treatment plan is developed. These often include one or more of our therapy services (group, physical, recreational and occupational), as well as family counseling, nutritional counseling, medication and relapse prevention.
- Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)
  - Designed to support and maintain mental and emotional health while providing our senior patients with the necessary tools to achieve mental well-being in an outpatient setting. IOP empowers you or a loved one to explore individual growth and heal within a group setting by participating in treatment during the day and returning home each afternoon.
- Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP)
  - Our partial hospitalization program provides an intense, structured setting for seniors who have difficulty maintaining current daily routines due to depression, anxiety or other mental health symptoms, and who could benefit from intensive, immediate, outpatient support and an evaluation by a psychiatrist.
  - This patient-centered treatment program provides flexible treatment options that are less intensive than an inpatient hospitalization while being more supportive than outpatient therapy alone.

Senior Behavioral Health is an inpatient psychiatry program designed to address the often complex mental health and medical needs of older patients, 65 and older.

- We provide a complete psychiatric evaluation and medical exam to determine a diagnostic and treatment options. Each patient is assigned a psychiatrist who leads a team in providing compassionate care, treatment and assists in planning for a fulfilling life after leaving the program.
- The typical length of stay is 12-14 days.
- Most Senior Behavioral Health patients will be admitted directly from a hospital emergency department. These transfers are coordinated by our team at West Pines. We also welcome referrals from private physicians, long-term care facilities, law enforcement professionals, and clinicians in the community.
