- Colorado's Crime Victim Compensation law created 22 different Crime Victim Compensation Programs that are in each judicial district across the state. You may qualify if:
 - You or your family member were physical, mentally, or emotionally injured, or died as a result of a crime that happened in Colorado after July 1, 1982.
 - You are the victim of a crime in Colorado that resulted in damage to your residence
