    - With easy access, you can just drive-thru or walk up, and receive your grocery box once every 14 days!
    - Pick up is available Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from 9:30 am to 11:30 am & 1 p.m. to 3 pm closed for lunch from 12 pm to 1 pm
    - Shopping appointments are available at 9 am and the last appointment would be at 3:45 pm, Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays closed for lunch from 12 pm to 1 pm
    - Mornings are quite busy stop by in the afternoons for quicker service!
    - No documentation required
    - Appointments are required!

  - If you live outside of the boundaries, you can make alternate delivery arrangements such as
    picking up your meals at Project Angel Heart or setting up delivery to a friend or family member
    who lives within the boundaries.
- Provides: Free, home-delivered meals tailored to meet each client's nutritional needs
- Notes: Program Application and Referral form must be signed by a licensed medical professional.

  - o To receive meals, an individual must be at least 60 years old and assessed as homebound.
  - o He or she must be Jewish or have a spiritual need to receive kosher meals.
  - The program not only provides nutritious meals but also reduces the stress of family members, who know their loved ones are getting a high-quality kosher meal every weekday.
  - Pantry Hours: Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 10 am 1 pm
  - Office Hours: Mondays -Thursdays from 8:15 am 4:45 pm and Fridays from 8:15 am 4:30 pm
- The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Food Pantry in Denver assists individuals and families facing hunger and food insecurity.
  - o Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays 10:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m.
