- Provides on demand, door to door transportation through a shared ride service.
- If you call to request a ride
 - Phone lines are open Monday through Friday 8:00 am – 4:30 pm
 - You will need the exact address of your destination
 - Rides can be scheduled 1-7 days before it is needed; Same day rides may be available
 - You will be notified immediately during the call if your request can be fulfilled
- If you submit a ride request online:
 - Online requests are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
 - You must submit your request at least 4 days in advance

- Services is by appointment only and 24 hours' notice is required (no same day transportation)
- Offers rides to seniors (60+) or individuals with disabilities for grocery shopping, Volunteers of America dining sites, medical appointments and other personal needs.
- On Demand Rides: \$6 round trip for a destination within the Lakewood city limits and \$8 round trip for a destination outside of the Lakewood city limits
 - A half price fare is available to those with a monthly income below \$1,011 for an individual and \$1,371 for a couple
 - Must submit an application (available online) and proof of income to qualify
- Grocery shopping
- There are no fares for Lakewood Rides thanks to the generous support of the Older Americans Act.
- Volunteers of America dining site: no charge for transportation to this event at the Clements Community Center.

Omnibus – City of Littleton

- Services is by appointment only and can be made up to 7 days in advance
- Same day trips can be scheduled, if there is availability
- Individuals must be a resident within the city limits of Littleton and be 60+ or disabled.
 - All transportation must be within the city limits of Littleton (only exception is Kaiser Permanente in Centennial and the Tri-County Health Department in Englewood)

- Ride Priorities
 - Medical appointments are given first priority
 - Grocery shopping
 - Hair and barber
 - Other activities by appointment as seating permits
- Can also pick up and deliver pre-paid grocery orders within the City of Littleton
- No cost but donations are appreciated.

- Connects Denver neighborhood seniors to a variety of programs including volunteer services, vetted service providers, and educational and social activities.
 - Transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, errands and social events (with reasonable distance and time commitment, usually 1 ride per household per week) – please allow 5 days' notice
 - Provides a variety of other assistance services, as well.
 - Need to be a member to receive services. If unable to afford the membership fees inquire about sliding fee scales that may be offered.

 - Grocery shopping trips to and from local food stores
 - Transportation to and from the post office, nursing homes, polling places, funeral services, volunteering locations, etc.
 - Trips to and from Congregate Dining Centers
 - Transportation to and from medical and dental appointments that exceed ten miles one-way and cross a county boundary
