By Appointment - Medicaid Eligible

Hours of Service: 24/7 | Must call between 8am-5pm, Monday – Friday to schedule a ride.

- Free transportation services available to Medicaid eligible clients to a Health First Colorado appointment/service (i.e., behavioral health, medical/physical health, and/or dental appointments).
 - Intelliride requires you to book your ride at least 3 days business days in advance to schedule transportation.
- Provides non-emergency medical transportation from/to: Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, Jefferson, Larimer, and Weld Counties.
 - If you live in any other county, contact your <u>local</u> <u>transportation provider</u> directly to schedule non-emergent transportation services.
- Urgent transportation is available for medically necessary services. These trips can be requested after a hospital discharge or for transportation to or from a critical, unplanned medical appointment.
 - To receive urgent transportation, please call Grace Connections: 1-678-491-6542
 - Serves Broomfield, Boulder, Denver, Douglas, and Jefferson counties.
- Additional Information:
 - Intelliride can provide bus tickets and/or reimburses for gas for a Medicaid appointment.
 - If you or someone you know has a vehicle, IntelliRide may cover the cost of gas between your home and your doctor or facility's office.
 - Medicaid recipients can call Intelliride to request bus tickets.
 - These also require prior notice to allow time to mail bus tickets, and to receive a confirmation number for the scheduled mileage reimbursement trip.
- A client's provider or care coordinator may submit the Medical Certificate of Transportation Services form (MCTS) to Intelliride to request privately contracted vehicles, or mileage reimbursement, as they feel it is medically necessary.
 - Licensed Providers or Care Coordinators can submit the MCTS form via fax or online at: https://gointelliride.com/colorado/
 - o If the round trip is 25+ miles, a separate form will be required.
- After the MCTS Form is submitted, clients should be able to call or go online to arrange future services.

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- Clients may also schedule their rides, bus tickets or mileage reimbursement requests after the initial contact by a provider, by calling or filling out online submission forms at: https://gointelliride.com/colorado/
- o Intelliride will give you a confirmation number for your trip or reimbursement. Be sure to write the confirmation number down.

- Avilable to the public by providing services similar to a ride share, such as extended bus service in specific Denver metro areas, delivering first- and last-mile connections to other RTD Park-n-Rides and stations, medical centers, and business parks.
- Cost:
 - Local price: \$3.00 one way
 - Discount price: \$1.50 one way. Available for those 65+, individuals with disabilities, and Medicare recipients
 - Youth or active-duty price: \$0.90 on way. Youth aged 6-19 (up to 3 children; aged under 5 is free), and active-duty members of the U.S. Military.
- Hours of Service: 4:50am-9:10pm. Hours will vary depending on the service area.
- Advance Time: Reservations can be made up to 30 days in advance and in as little as 10 minutes prior to pick up time.
- Trips are within service areas only, Need exact cash for bus fare.

- The program provides transportation at no cost to older adults through a variety of contractors, including the Regional Transportation District (RTD), HopSkipDrive (HSD), and Uber.
- To schedule a ride: Call the ride line no less than (3) business days advance notice to request rides with HopSkipDrive or to make changes to an existing ride.
- Call to request RTD bus tickets or Access-A-Ride tickets which will be mailed to the recipient, depending on availability, within 7 business days.
- If you have Medicare and Medicaid, you may be eligible for a \$400 Uber voucher. Call to apply.

- Hours of Service: M-F 7am-5pm to schedule appointment; M-F 8am 4pm transportation available.
- Time frame to submit ride request: Up to 2 weeks maximum for all rides.
 - o All rides are scheduled on a first-come first-served basis.

- Can pick up and deliver pre-paid grocery orders within the City of Littleton.
- Partners with Via Mobility Services.
- Hours of Service: M-F 8am 4:30pm to schedule appointment; M-F 8am 2pm transportation available.
- Advance Time: Reservations can be made up to 7 business days in advance, same day trips can be scheduled if there is availability.

- Services Available for: ADA Certified Only. Provides transportation to passengers with disabilities who
 are unable to use regular buses and who qualify for persons due to having mobility issues or having a
 cognitive disability that prohibits their understanding of how to complete bus trips.

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- Must submit a written application, a medical verification completed by a licensed professional, an inperson interview, and a transportation assessment.
- Cost: Local one-way: \$5, Regional one-way: \$9, Airport one-way: \$20, Local 6-Ride Ticket Book: \$30.
 - Pay in exact cash when boarding, or buy tickets through the RTD Mobile Tickets App
- Hours of Service: M-F 8am 5pm to schedule transportation, transportation corresponds to fixed route hours and days.
- Advance Time: 1-3 business days

Car Repairs, Donations, Emission/Repair Waivers

Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) – Emissions, Repair, and Diagnostic Waiver Program https://dmv.colorado.gov/emissions-waivers

- There are three types of waivers: repair, diagnostic and economic hardship.
 - Waivers cannot be issued for vehicles that smoke or have missing or tampered emission components.
 - Waivers cannot be issued to vehicles that failed the emissions test due to a gas cap failure.

Gas & Deisel Emission Waivers

- If your vehicle failed an emissions test, you may be eligible to apply for an emissions waiver.
- A waiver is a certificate of emission control that allows you to register a vehicle without complying with emissions standards.
- If an emissions waiver is granted, it is valid for one emissions cycle.
- CDOT will waive Gas and Deisel failed emissions if meeting the following qualifications:
 - o Requirements for 1968 and newer gas vehicles:
 - Failed emissions test
 - \$715 in emissions related repairs
 - Second failed emission test

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- Requirements for 1967 and older gas-powered vehicles:
 - Failed emissions test
 - \$75 in emissions related repairs
 - Second failed emissions test

- If your vehicle is displaying temporary license plates, please call 303-205-5603 to complete the waiver application.

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Economic Hardship Waiver (Emissions) - Gasoline Powered Vehicles Only

- Eligibility Requirements
 - One failed emissions test is required
 - No minimum repairs necessary.
 - The vehicle owner must be receiving assistance from an established and approved public assistance program.
 - Applicants are allowed no more than two vehicles titled in their name.

Repair Waiver - Diesel Powered Vehicles

- Light-duty 14,000 GVW or less:
 - Failed emissions test.
 - \$750 in emissions related repairs.
 - o Second failed emissions test.
- Heavy-duty 14.001 GVW or more:
 - Failed emissions test.
 - o \$1500 in emissions related repairs.
 - Second failed emissions test.

- Also, must have a valid driver's license and reside in any of the following counties: Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, or Jefferson County.
- Provides: Auto repair, maintenance, and vehicle acquisition
- Additional info for vehicle acquisition: Provides a limited number of cars (based on availability) for approved clients needing a low-cost vehicle for a short-term basis.
- They do not repair air conditioners, rebuild, or replace engines and transmissions, repair damage that is the result of an accident or vandalism, and repair vehicles with an ignition interlock device or breath alcohol ignition interlock device (IID and BAIID).

- Provides: Donates vehicles and other assistance to families in need. Eligible individuals include disadvantaged children, people with serious illnesses, veterans, elderly, disabled, underemployed, etc.
- Do not call for assistance, use the website to apply.

- Applicants need to register before applying for assistance. An active email account is required to register.
- Offers Self-Sufficiency grants to qualified low-income individuals/households who need help to afford an unexpected or emergency expense that they could not afford without a short-term hand-up, including auto repair.
- Applicants must meet the following income and employment guidelines:

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- At least one adult member of the applicant's household must be able to provide documentation of employment at the time of the application AND
- The primary (largest) source of income for each applicant's household <u>must</u> be either income earned from employment; or child support payments; or Veteran's Benefits; or retirement income (including Social Security retirement benefits).
- Do not call for assistance, use the website to apply.

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
