- Non-Emergency Medical Transportation from/to: Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, Jefferson, Larimer, and Weld Counties.
- Free transportation services available to Medicaid eligible clients to a Health First Colorado medical appointment/service.
- Hours of Service: 24/7; Must call between 8am-5pm, Monday – Friday to schedule ride.
- Intelliride requires at least 2 days (48 hours) advance notice to schedule transportation.
- Additional Information:
 - Appointments must be covered by Medicaid (medical, dental, mental health).
 - Intelliride provides bus tickets for appointments and/or reimburses for gas.
 - These also require prior notice to allow time to mail bus tickets, and to receive a confirmation number for the scheduled mileage reimbursement trip
- Clients can call Intelliride directly to request bus tickets for any Medicaid appointment at 303-398-2155.
- A client's provider or care coordinator may submit the Medical Certificate of Transportation Services form (MCTS) to Intelliride to request privately contracted vehicles, or mileage reimbursement, as they feel it is medically necessary.
 - Licensed Provider or Care Coordinator can submit the MCTS form via fax or online at:

 - If the round trip is 25+ miles, a separate form will be required.

- Cost: \$3.00 one way. Discounts available for those 65+, individuals with disabilities, Medicare recipients, youth aged 6-19 (under 5 is free), and active-duty members of the U.S. Military.
- Hours of Service: 4:50am-9:10pm- will vary depending on service area.
- Advance Time: Reservations can be made up to 30 days in advance and in as little as 10 minutes prior to pickup time.
- Additional Info: Trips are within service areas only, Need exact cash for bus fare.

- The program provides transportation at no cost to older adults through a variety of contractors, including the Regional Transportation District (RTD), HopSkipDrive (HSD), and Uber.
- To schedule a ride: Call the ride line no less than (3) business days advance notice to request rides with HopSkipDrive or to make changes to an existing ride.
- Call to request RTD bus tickets or Access-A-Ride tickets which will be mailed to the recipient, depending on availability, within 7 business days.
- If you have Medicare and Medicaid, you may be eligible for a \$400 Uber voucher. Call to apply.

- Services Available for: ADA Certified Only. Provides transportation to passengers with disabilities who are unable to use regular buses and who qualify for persons due to having mobility issues or having a cognitive disability that prohibits their understanding of how to complete bus trips.
- Cost: Local one-way: \$5, Regional one-way: \$9, Airport one-way: \$20. Pay in exact cash when boarding, or buy tickets through the [RTD Mobile Tickets App](#)
- Hours of Service: M-F 8am – 5pm to schedule transportation, transportation corresponds to fixed route hours and days.
- Advance Time: 1-3 business days
- Additional Info: Must submit a written application, a medical verification completed by a licensed professional, an in-person interview, and a transportation assessment.

- Additional info for repairs: Requires clients to pay 50% of total repairs, repairs provided for non-luxury and non-sport vehicles that are less than 20 years old. Must have CO driver's license, current auto insurance, your name on registration, and have owned the vehicle for at least six months.
- Additional info for vehicle acquisition: Provides a limited number of cars (based on availability) for approved clients needing a low-cost vehicle for a short-term basis.
- They do not repair air conditioners, rebuild or replace engines and transmissions, repair damage that is the result of an accident or vandalism, and repair vehicles with an ignition interlock device or breath alcohol ignition interlock device (IID and BAID).

- Provides: Vehicle donations for victims of domestic violence, those with physical challenges, families living in homeless shelters (with or without children), self-supporting families making the move from public assistance, and military families
- Additional Info: Applicants must apply online at website above. Applicants will provide a short statement about your vehicle needs and the situation you are in. You will only be contacted if you are selected to receive a gifted vehicle.

With Causes Charitable Network

- Provides: Donates vehicles and other assistance to families in need. Eligible individuals include disadvantaged children, people with serious illnesses, veterans, elderly, disabled, underemployed, etc.

Modest Needs

- Applicants need to register before applying for assistance. An active email account is required to register.
- Offers Self-Sufficiency grants to qualified low-income individuals/households who need help to afford an unexpected or emergency expense that they could not afford without a short term hand-up, including auto repair.
- Applicants must meet the following income and employment guidelines:
 - At least one adult member of the applicant's household must be able to provide documentation of employment at the time of the application AND
 - The primary (largest) source of income for each applicant's household must be either income earned from employment; or child support payments; or Veteran's Benefits; or retirement income (including Social Security retirement benefits).
