- Provides a variety of low-cost veterinary services including spay/neuters, vaccine and microchip clinics, and end of life services.
 - Spay and Neuter services: an appointment is required
 - Vaccine Clinics are held every Friday at the shelter from 3-4:30pm
 - End of Life Services are available Monday through Friday between 11 am and 5 pm and Saturday and Sunday 10 am to 4 pm.
- Cremation and euthanasia services are also available by appointment
 - Fees and eligibility requirements for services can be found on their website.
- Offers a program that can care for pets for up to 10 days for families/individuals who have been evicted, are in the hospital, detox, or have been victims of domestic violence.
 - Vaccines and veterinary care are also provided during that time.

 - Services include exams, minor medical treatment, vaccines, heartworm testing and medication, nail trims, vouchers for free spay and neuters and matted hair shaving (as medically necessary)
 - Pet supplies available include dog and cat toys, dog and cat food, leashes and collars, pet jackets, pet beds and carriers.
 - Clinic dates for 2020 are available online. Services are held the first Thursday of every month.
 - To qualify for services, individual must bring proof of one of the following:
 - Quest or EBT Card
 - Paystub check showing an income of *no more* than \$769 every two weeks
 - Income tax return showing less than \$30,00 gross income per year
 - Unemployment check stub with current date
 - Medicaid card
 - SSI ID or Letter
 - WIC
 - Or must be currently experiencing homelessness

- Nibbles and Kibbles Program
 - Provides free cat food and supplies to people who are experiencing temporary financial challenges.
 - Items available include litter boxes and scoops, feeding mats, carriers, grooming materials, toys, food and water bowls, electric feeders, harnesses, collars, leashes, and scratchers. Please note that items may not always be available and quantities are dispersed based on supply.
 - The pantry is open for free to community members in need on the first or third Saturday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon. Due to Nibbles & Kibbles being an emergency source of food, we cannot accommodate private appointments outside of these hours at this time.
- Temporary Care Program
 - Provides temporary care for individuals who are unable to care of their cats for up to 6 weeks due to a home foreclosure, domestic violence, temporary homelessness, or an extended hospital stay.
 - Food, shelter, and medical care is provided for cats for up to 6 weeks.

 - Depending on income, individuals will qualify for one of two vouchers:
 - A \$60.00 voucher towards a spay/neuter
 - A voucher that will pay 100% for individuals that qualify.
 - Income guidelines can be found online.
 - Individuals must take their pets to one of the participating veterinarians listed on the website.

- Provides financial support for individuals who have an animal that has a life threatening or critical injury or illness that requires a specific treatment that is not ongoing. The animal must have a "favorable prognosis".
- Income Guidelines/Eligibility:
 - Individuals must meet income guidelines that fall under the WIC program (found on website) or have one of the following:
 - Medicaid
 - Food Assistance Card
 - SSDI
 - Unemployment Benefits
 - Other government assistance
- Things to Consider Before Applying:
 - The applicant must obtain a diagnosis and treatment plan prior to applying
 - Dylan's Hearts cannot pay for existing veterinary bills
 - Applications can only be accepted if the Veterinarian completes them
 - The applicant agrees to provide updates and photos of the animal.
 - The Veterinary Clinic must be willing to do the following:
 - Provide an itemized estimate of the planned treatment
 - Accept payment from Dylan's Heart
 - Provide updates on treatment to Dylan's Hearts
- Application is available online and must be completed by the veterinarian that is providing the pet with treatment.

 - Pet must have been provided routine veterinary care. This includes: vaccinations, periodic wellness exams, and being spayed/neutered if the pet is over the age of 1 year.
 - Proof of financial need
 - Have a written diagnosis and an itemized estimate for treatment from a veterinarian

- Pet has received a prognosis of “fair or better”.
 - An itemized estimate for treatment
- Pets that have chronic health conditions or have already been treated are eligible for assistance.
 - There is also a list of treatments/illnesses that are not covered.
- Maximum amount of financial assistance available is \$500.00.
- Application for financial assistance is available online.
