Requirements to Register to Vote

- Must be a United States citizen
- Must be 18 years old by the date of the next election
- Must be a resident of the state of Colorado for at least 22 days before the election in which you plan to vote
- May not be serving a term of imprisonment for a felony conviction

Register Online

Register In Person

- Register in person at the following offices:
 - o DMV offices when you apply for or renew your driver's license
 - Military recruitment offices
 - Voter service and polling centers
 - Public assistance offices
- Contact Navigation if you need assistance finding the nearest location.

If Homeless

- Voter registration requires a physical and mailing address.
- You may use any physical address within a specific county that you regularly return to and intend to remain. This can include a shelter, homeless service provide, park, campground, vacant lot, etc.
- Your mailing address does not need to be within the same county as your physical address. A P.O. box is acceptable but cannot be used as a physical address.

There are several ways to register to vote. Registration forms are processed within two weeks, and you will receive an official information card in the mail after the form is processed.
